THIEF STEALS €103M WORTH OF DIAMONDS FROM HOTEL

A single armed robber has held ¹ _____ a jewellery exhibition at the Carlton Hotel in Cannes on the French Riviera. The man entered the building through an open window on Sunday morning, threatened three security guards, two sales people and a manager with a gun, and ² _____ off with the jewels in a briefcase. The incident lasted about a minute. No shots were fired and ³ _____ was hurt.

With the value of the stolen diamonds estimated at 103 million euros, this may be the largest jewel robbery in history. Police suspect the 'Pink Panther' gang, which specialises in jewellery theft, may be responsible. Several members of the gang ⁴ _____ of a prison in Switzerland last Thursday.

The theft is the latest in a series of high-profile robberies in Cannes, which is famous for its annual film festival. The Carlton, the favourite hotel of film stars during the festival, is also where Alfred Hitchcock ⁵ _____ *To Catch A Thief*, a 1955 thriller about a jewel thief, starring Cary Grant and Grace Kelly.
